Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage is an <u>orphanage</u>, <u>nursery</u> and <u>captive breeding</u> ground for wild <u>Asian</u> <u>elephants</u> located at <u>Pinnawala</u> village, 13 km (8.1 mi) northeast of <u>Kegalle</u> town in <u>Sabaragamuwa Province</u> of <u>Sri Lanka</u>. Pinnawala has the largest herd of captive elephants in the world. In 2011, there were 10965 elephants, including 4643 males and 968 females from 3 generations, living in Pinnawala.^[1] The orphanage was founded to care and protect the many orphaned unweaned wild elephants

is a <u>Buddhist</u> temple in the city of <u>Kandy</u>, <u>Sri</u> <u>Lanka</u>. It is located in the royal palace complex of the former <u>Kingdom of Kandy</u>, which houses the <u>relic of the tooth of the Buddha</u>. Since ancient times, the relic has played an important role in local politics because it is believed that whoever holds the relic holds the governance of the country. Kandy was the last capital of the Sri Lankan kings and is a <u>World Heritage</u> <u>Site</u> mainly due to the temple. Entry fee: USD \$10 pp approx.**The Sri Dalada Maligawa has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site**.
